<u>Landscaping:</u> We have set up a Landscape Committee chaired by new Board member Doug Stites. He is currently gathering neighbors to serve on it. More information about their plans will be coming soon.

We have lost so many beautiful neighborhood trees because of the extremely hot and dry summer. We've had to remove at least 5 large dead trees from the greenbelt. Many of those were Pine trees which do not do well here in the desert. Our goal is to save as many trees as possible and to replace those that have died with a more sustainable tree for the desert.

One type of tree that appears to handle the extreme heat/cold is the red push pistache. They are a favorite with landscapers, growing like a big lollipop without needing much trimming and providing good shade. Give them a year or so to start and then they will take off. There's several at various stages in our neighborhood and we have planted three in the drainage area by the railroad. Please remember our Design Review Guidelines require each front yard to have at least one tree.

<u>Speed Hump on Post</u>: The speed hump on Post road has been brought to the attention of the City of Chandler Street and Planning. Board member Dr. Bill Crawford has gotten a commitment from the city to do another study to determine if the speed hump is warranted. It appears that this will not happen until late 2024 or early 2025. We will continue to follow up as it is of big concern to our residents.
